Shortly before his passing in 1810, Rebbe Nachman (1772-1810), a great-grandson of the Baal Shem Tov, founder of the Chasidic movement, told his followers that his influence would long endure. "My fire will burn until the Mashiach (Messiah) comes." His words could not have been more prophetic. Generations of readers have been enthralled and inspired by his writings. Recently, we have witnessed masses of searching Jews of all backgrounds uniting in spiritual pursuit, seeking to understand and acquire the teachings of this great tzaddik. A common barrier prevents many from properly accessing these great works - language. Since its inception in 1979, BRI has been the main publishing house for translations of classic and contemporary Breslov books. More than 100 titles are currently in print. May all who are spiritually thirsty, come and drink.

About Likutey Moharan

Diver 30 years ago, one man dreamed of making Likutey Moharan, Rebbe Nachman's magnum opus containing all his major lessons, accessible to the English-speaking world. Since then, 15 volumes containing over 6,500 pages of translation and commentary have been published. Hebrew, Spanish, French and Russian editions are now underway. On February 10, 2013, (איש הוא בור (לישנו) (שנו) Jews of all stripes will stand together in celebration of this amazing accomplishment and bring recognition to this wondrous body of knowledge now available for the taking.

In Loving Memory of Rabbi Tzvi Aryeh Rosenfeld Za'l

Rabbi Rosenfeld was the first to disseminate Breslov teachings among public-school students in New York; the first to translate the entire Likutey Moharan onto reel-toreel tapes; and the first to produce Breslov



books in English together with one of his prime students, Rabbi Aryeh Kaplan. BRI was also his brainchild, and the more than 100 titles that we have published in our 33-year history are due to him.
