## Suggested Order of Study of The Works of Breslover Chassidut

Building on the previous post on How to Learn Likutey Moharan, here is a piece from Crossing The Narrow Bridge, A Practical Guide To Rebbe Nachman's Teachings (Page 427-428) by The Breslov Research Institute.

The following is a *suggested* sequence by which to approach the works of Breslover Chassidut. Three separate schedules have been provided, based on your background in Judaism in general, and your ability to understand Hebrew texts. What is common to all three is the recitation of the prayers in Lekutey Tefilot, as these heartfelt prayers will open the way to the heart.

- C) For those with (some) knowledge of Hebrew:

- 5) Likutey Morahan; The Aleph-Bet Book (Hebrew version with sources)
